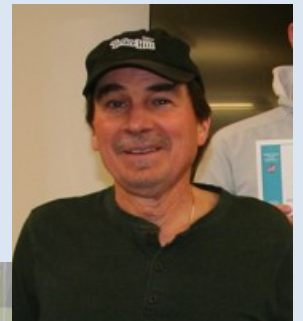

PREPARE FOR COLD WATER BOATING



BEFORE YOU LEAVE THE DOCK

- Dress for the water temperature, not the air temperature
- Bring an extra set of clothes in case you get wet
- File a float plan with the details of your trip with someone you trust
- Make sure everyone is wearing a life jacket



DON'T PANIC IF YOU FALL INTO COLD WATER

- An unexpected fall into cold water causes an involuntary gasp reflex – quickly regain control of your breathing
- Keep afloat with the help of your life jacket, keep your head above water, and stay with the boat if possible
- Get into the HELP position (Heat Escape Lessening Posture) by crossing your arms across your chest and pull your knees up to your chest, as if hugging yourself
- If you are with other people, you can lessen heat escape if you huddle together



FACTS

- It takes less than ½ cup of water in your lungs to drown
- Even experienced swimmers can experience shock within one minute in the frigid water and may lose muscle control within 10 minutes



Memorial Day marks the unofficial start of summer and the target date for most boaters to be in the water. Long past the typical launch dates for us on Lake Michigan, where the marinas open in April and we try to squeeze in every allowable month on the water until they close in October.

Considering the beautiful, warm weather we are having, you might not be thinking about cold water boating. However, as we move into June, the water temperature today in Lake Michigan near Chicago is 59.5°F. According to SeaTemperature.Info, the coldest temp today is 50.4°F at Whitefish Dunes. That is dangerously cold and poses greater risk of hypothermia if you fall into the water.

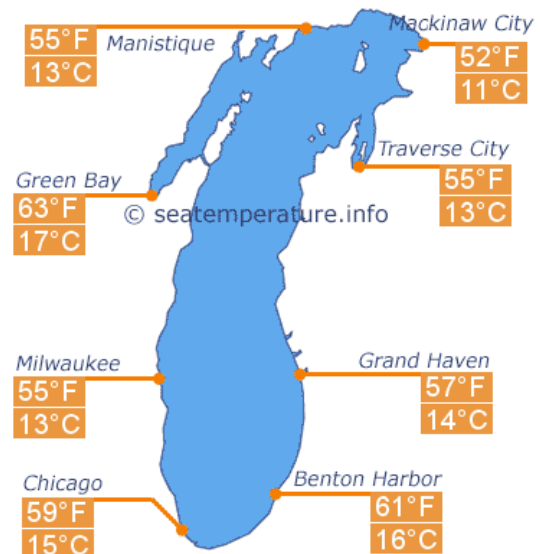
With this in mind, it is a good time to brush up on the key safety tips show here before you go out on the water. And remember to use the America's Boating Club mobile app for a quick and easy way to file a float plan.

If you are traveling the Great Lakes this summer, be sure to check the water temperatures. Anything below 69.8°F may be too cold for extended swimming.

The website SeaTemperature.Info (click on the map below) has water temperatures all over the world and specifically includes the Great Lakes. You can check the temperature for any port city.

Water temperature map of Lake Michigan today

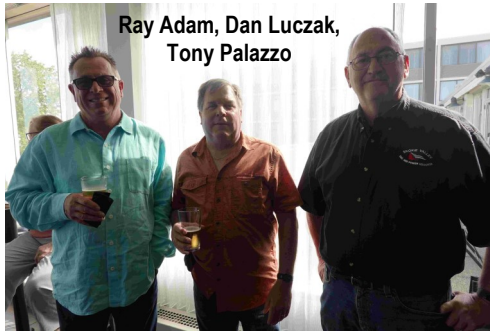
The map shows Lake Michigan temperature water in some coastal cities in real time

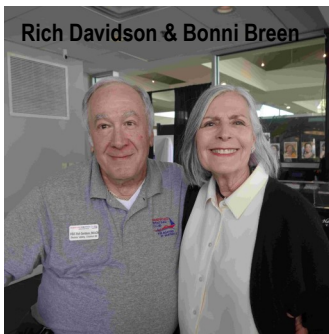

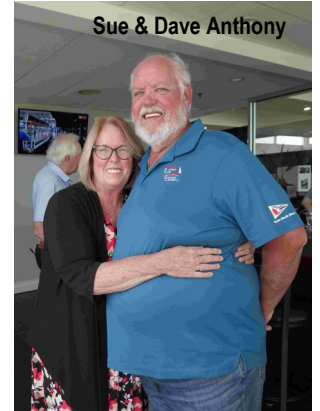

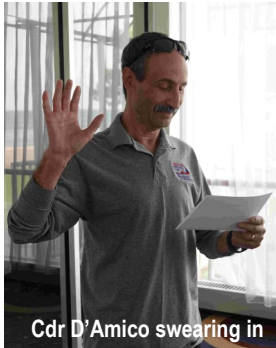

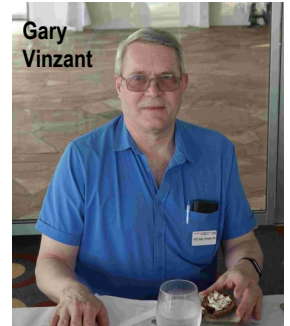
